

But guess what? Daniel loved God so much that he continued to pray three times a day, just like he always did.


Luke 10:27 And he answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

READ 1 SAMUEL 17




#### COURAGEOUS KIDS NOAH AND THE ARK


Even when others don't understand or question what you're doing, if you trust God and follow His ways, amazing things can happen.

## COURAGEOUS KIDS THE THREE HEBREW BOYS





**READ DANIEL 3**

King Nebuchadnezzar was furious and ordered the furnace to be heated seven times hotter than usual.

As the three friends were thrown into the blazing furnace, something incredible happened.



Instead of being consumed by the fire, they walked around unharmed, and there was even a fourth person in the furnace with them, whom many believe was an angel of God. The king witnessed this miracle and recognized the greatness of the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego.



The king then praised God and honored the three friends, who emerged from the furnace without a single burn or smell of smoke. Their faithfulness and courage had been rewarded by God's protection.

Daniel 3:28–29 "Then Nebuchadnezzar said, 'Praise be to the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, who has sent his angel and rescued his servants! They trusted in him and defied the king's command and were willing to give up their lives rather than serve or worship any god except their own God. Therefore, I decree that the people of any nation or language who say anything against the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego be cut into pieces and their houses be turned into piles of rubble, for no other god can save in this way."

What can we learn from Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego? Their story teaches us about the importance of trusting God, even when it's difficult or risky.

They stood firm in their faith and refused to compromise, even in the face of a fiery furnace. Th knew that God was more powerful than any challenge they faced.


READ JUDGES 6-8)
