This 7-day devotional is designed to help you explore biblical principles and practical steps for finding and fulfilling God's will. Each day includes a scripture focus, reflection questions, and a prayer to guide you in seeking His direction.

Whether you're facing a major decision or simply longing to walk more closely with God, this devotional will encourage and equip you to trust His guidance.

Let's begin the journey together, knowing that God's plans for you are good, purposeful, and filled with hope.



Day 1: Seek God First

"But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." – Matthew 6:33 (ESV)

God's will begins with prioritizing Him above eventhing also Often we
God's will begins with prioritizing Him above everything else. Often, we get caught up in striving for our own goals or figuring out life on our terms. But Jesus invites us to seek Him first. As we make God's kingdom our priority, He aligns our desires with His perfect plan. Reflection: Are you seeking God first in your daily life? What steps can you take to prioritize Him?

Day 2: trust in Gods Plan

Scripture: "Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established." – Proverbs 16:3 (ESV)

Trusting God's plan requires surrender. Even when circumstances seem uncertain, we can rest in the truth that He has good plans for us His will is not something we must fear but something to embrace with faith. Reflection: Are you holding on to your own plans too tightly? How can you surrender your future to God?

Day 3: Delight in the Lord

"Delight yourself in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart." – Psalm 37:4 (ESV)

The Hebrew word for "delight" in this verse, "anag," carries a sense of softening, being pliable, or taking exquisite pleasure in someone of something. To delight in the Lord means to allow your heart to be moldable in His hands and to find deep joy in His presence. When we delight in Him this way, our desires become aligned with His will, an He faithfully fulfills those desires in His perfect timing. Reflection: I what ways are you yielding your heart to God's shaping?

Day 4: Listen to Gods Voice

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." – Psalm 119:105 (ESV)

God speaks to us through His Word, prayer, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. When we take time to listen, we position ourselves to understand His will. His voice often comes in stillness, not in chaos. Reflection: Are you making time to hear God's voice? What distractions
can you set aside to focus on Him?

Day 5: Walk in Obedience

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments." – John 14:15 (ESV)

God reveals His will step by step as we walk in obedience. Sometimes, He asks us to take small steps of faith before showing the bigger picture. Obedience is a key part of fulfilling His plan. Reflection: Are there areas in your life where you need to step out in obedience? What is God calling you to do today?

Day 6: Level Playing Field

"There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."—Galatians 3:28

Day 6: Serve Others Scripture: "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for
good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." – Ephesians 2:10 (ESV)
Part of God's will for our lives is to serve others and use the gifts He's given us for His glory. When we step into the good works He has prepared for us, we find fulfillment and purpose.
Reflection: How can you use your gifts to serve others? Who is God calling you to bless today?

Day 7: Boldy Approach the Throne of Grace

Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. (Hebrews 4:16)

Scripture: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." – Ecclesiastes 3:1 (ESV)

God's will is often revealed in His perfect timing. While waiting can be challenging, it is an opportunity to grow in faith and patience. Trust that He will bring everything together at the right time.

Reflection: Are you trusting God's timing, or are you feeling impatient? How can you cultivate patience as you wait?
