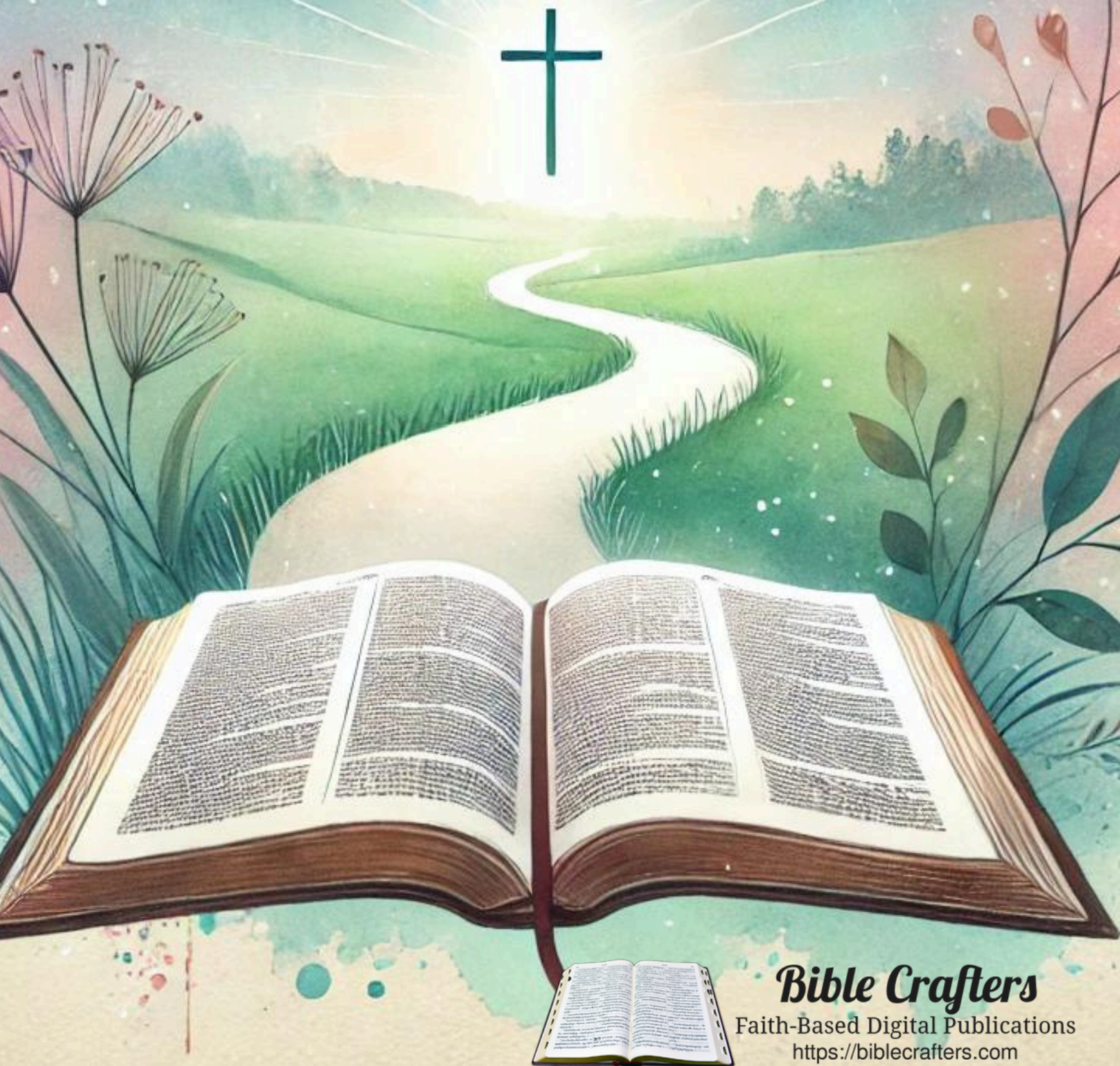


PATHWAY TO DISCERNMENT

30 DAY DEVOTIONAL JOURNAL



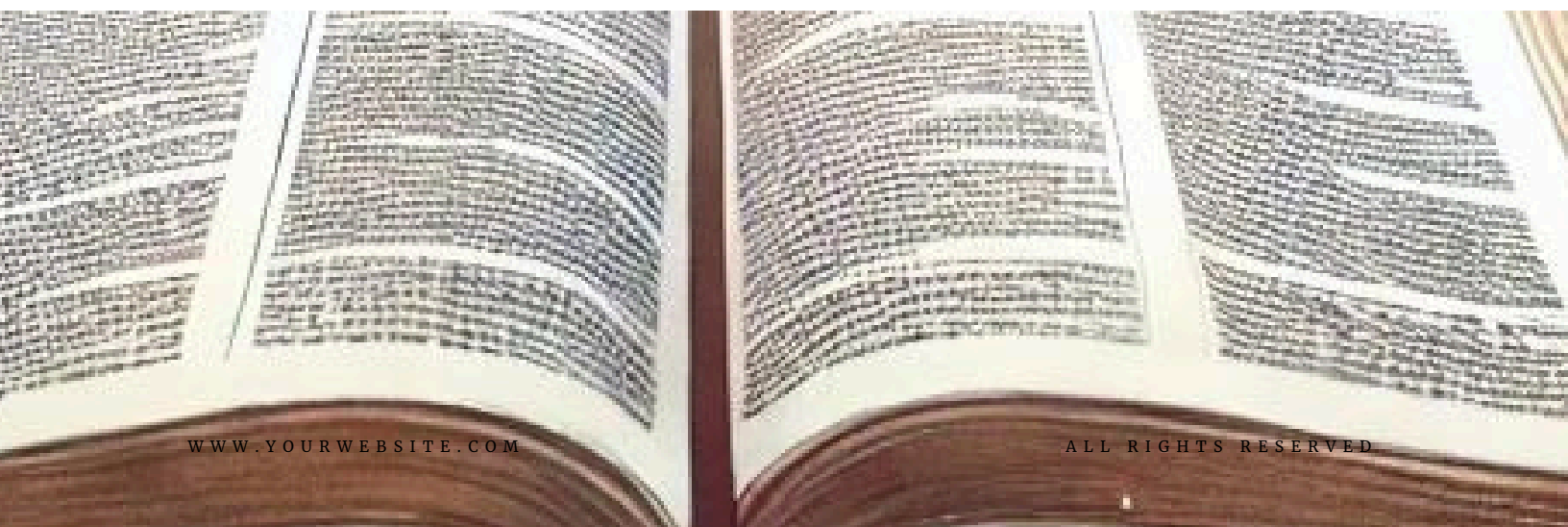

the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God. - Proverbs 2:3-5

God's wisdom and the steps you can take to prioritize this pursuit in your life.

Reflection: How earnestly do you seek God's wisdom in your daily life?

If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you." - James 1:5

God generously gives wisdom to those who ask. Discernment comes from God, and He is willing to provide it when we seek Him in faith. This verse reminds us that God is not only able but also eager to grant us the wisdom we need. Consider the areas in your life where you need discernment and take the step of asking God for His guidance, trusting in His willingness to provide it.

Reflection: Do you regularly ask God for wisdom and discernment?

The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit." - 1 Corinthians 2:14

The Holy Spirit helps us understand spiritual truths that cannot be discerned by natural means. Spiritual discernment is a gift of the Holy Spirit, allowing us to see beyond the surface and understand God's deeper truths. Reflect on how you can become more attuned to the Holy Spirit's guidance and be open to His teaching, which enables you to discern God's will and direction in your life.

Reflection: How can you become more attuned to the Holy Spirit's guidance in your life?

Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world." - 1 John 4:1

We are instructed to test the spirits to see whether they are from God. Discernment involves evaluating teachings and influences according to biblical truth. Reflect on how you currently test spiritual influences and consider how you can strengthen your ability to discern what is from God and what is not.

Reflection: How do you test the spiritual influences in your life?

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction." – Proverbs 1:7

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction. True discernment starts with a reverent awe of God. Reflect on how your reverence for God influences your ability to discern His will and make wise decisions.

Reflection: How does your reverence for God influence your ability to discern?

And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ." - Philippians 1:9-10

Paul prays for love to abound in knowledge and depth of insight, enabling believers to discern what is best. Discernment is crucial for making wise decisions that honor God and align with His purposes. Reflect on your current decision-making process and consider how you can incorporate discernment to ensure your choices are pleasing to God.

Reflection: How can you incorporate discernment into your daily decision-making process?

Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will." - Romans 12:2

Discernment involves transforming our minds to test and approve God's will. This transformation comes from renewing our minds through God's Word and the work of the Holy Spirit. Reflect on areas in your life where you need transformation and how you can renew your mind to better discern God's will.

Reflection: How can you renew your mind to better discern God's will?

Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it." -
Proverbs 4:23

We are called to guard our hearts above all else, for everything we do flows from it. Discernment helps us protect our hearts from harmful influences and ensures that our actions align with God's will. Reflect on the state of your heart and the influences you allow into your life. Consider practical steps you can take to guard your heart more effectively.

Reflection: What steps can you take to guard your heart more effectively?

But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere." - James 3:17

Wisdom from above is pure, peace-loving, considerate, and full of mercy. Discernment helps us navigate conflicts in a way that honors God and promotes peace. Reflect on how you handle conflicts and consider how you can use discernment to respond with wisdom and grace.

Reflection: How can you use discernment to handle conflicts more gracefully?

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Reflection: How do you distinguish between true and false teachings?

So give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong. For who is able to govern this great people of yours? The Lord was pleased that Solomon had asked for this." - 1 Kings 3:9-10

Solomon asked God for a discerning heart to govern the people and distinguish between right and wrong. God granted his request, making him renowned for his wisdom. Reflect on Solomon's humility and his recognition of his need for God's wisdom. Consider how you can model this humility in your own prayers for discernment.

Reflection: What can you learn from Solomon's example in seeking discernment?

But Daniel resolved not to defile himself with the royal food and wine, and he asked the chief official for permission not to defile himself this way. To these four young men God gave knowledge and understanding of all kinds of literature and learning. And Daniel could understand visions and dreams of all kinds." - Daniel 1:8, 17

Daniel resolved not to defile himself with the king's food and relied on God's wisdom to navigate life in Babylon. His discernment led to favor and influence. Reflect on Daniel's commitment to God's standards and how his discernment guided his actions. Consider how you can stand firm in your convictions and seek God's wisdom in challenging situations.

Reflection: How can you stand firm in your convictions and seek God's wisdom in challenging situations?

Jesus answered, 'It is written: "Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God."' Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said, 'throw yourself down. For it is written: "He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."' Jesus answered him, 'It is also written: "Do not put the Lord your God to the test."' - Matthew 4:4-7

Jesus demonstrated perfect discernment in the wilderness, using Scripture to counter Satan's temptations. His example shows the power of knowing God's Word and relying on it in times of temptation. Reflect on how you can use Scripture to strengthen your discernment and resist temptation in your life.

Reflection: How can you use Scripture to strengthen your discernment in times of temptation?

Now the Berean Jews were of more noble character than those in Thessalonica, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true. As a result, many of them believed, as did also a number of prominent Greek women and many Greek men." - Acts 17:11-12

The Bereans were commended for examining the Scriptures daily to verify Paul's teachings. Their example highlights the importance of testing everything against Scripture. Reflect on your approach to teachings and beliefs and consider how diligently you examine them against the Bible.

Reflection: How diligently do you examine teachings and beliefs against the Bible?

He said to the crowd: "When you see a cloud rising in the west, immediately you say, "It's going to rain," and it does. And when the south wind blows, you say, "It's going to be hot," and it is. Hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of the earth and the sky. How is it that you don't know how to interpret this present time?" - Luke 12:54-56

Jesus rebuked the crowd for failing to discern the present time. Being aware of spiritual and worldly conditions is crucial for proper discernment. Reflect on your awareness of the spiritual and cultural times we live in and consider how you can become more discerning in interpreting these times.

Reflection: How can you become more aware of the spiritual and cultural times we live in?

Abigail acted quickly. She took two hundred loaves of bread, two skins of wine, five dressed sheep, five seahs of roasted grain, a hundred cakes of raisins and two hundred cakes of pressed figs, and loaded them on donkeys. When Abigail saw David, she quickly got off her donkey and bowed down before David with her face to the ground. She fell at his feet and said: 'Pardon your servant, my lord, and let me speak to you; hear what your servant has to say.'" - 1 Samuel 25:18, 23-24

Abigail demonstrated discernment and wisdom in her dealings with David, preventing bloodshed and earning his respect. Her actions highlight the impact of wise intervention in conflict. Reflect on how you can practice wisdom and discernment in resolving conflicts in your life.

Reflection: How can you practice wisdom and discernment in resolving conflicts?

Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.'

Jesus replied, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven.'" - Matthew 16:16-17

Peter's declaration that Jesus is the Christ was revealed to him by God. This example shows the importance of divine revelation in discernment. Reflect on how you can seek and recognize divine revelation in your life and consider how God has revealed His truths to you.

Reflection: How can you seek and recognize divine revelation in your life?

I am your servant; give me discernment that I may understand
your statutes." – Psalm 119:125

The psalmist asks for discernment to understand God's statutes. Regularly seeking discernment in our daily walk helps us live in alignment with God's Word. Reflect on your daily routines and consider how you can incorporate seeking discernment into your everyday life.

Reflection: How can you incorporate seeking discernment into your daily routine?

When all Israel heard the verdict the king had given, they held the king in awe, because they saw that he had wisdom from God to administer justice." - 1 Kings 3:28

Solomon's wise judgment in the case of the two women earned him respect and trust as a leader. Discernment is crucial for effective and just leadership. Reflect on your roles of leadership or influence and consider how you can apply discernment to lead wisely and justly.

Reflection: How can you apply discernment in your roles of leadership or influence?

to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another
distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different
kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of
tongues." - 1 Corinthians 12:10

Discernment of spirits is a spiritual gift that helps identify the source of spiritual manifestations. This gift is vital for maintaining spiritual purity in the church. Reflect on your spiritual gifts and consider how you can cultivate and use the gift of discerning spirits to benefit the body of Christ.

Reflection: How can you cultivate and use the gift of discerning spirits?

And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ." -
Philippians 1:9-10

Paul's prayer for the Philippians includes a desire for their love to abound in knowledge and discernment. Praying for discernment helps us align our requests with God's will. Reflect on your prayer life and consider how you can pray more effectively for discernment and deeper insight.

Reflection: How can you pray more effectively for discernment?

As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." -
Proverbs 27:17

Seeking counsel and accountability helps refine our discernment and decision-making. Reflect on the people in your life who provide you with wise counsel and accountability. Consider how you can strengthen these relationships to enhance your discernment and growth.

Reflection: Who can you seek out for wise counsel and accountability to help sharpen your discernment?

Therefore, my brothers and sisters, make every effort to confirm your calling and election. For if you do these things, you will never stumble." -
2 Peter 1:10

Discernment is essential for understanding and confirming our calling. Reflect on your unique gifts and passions, and consider how you can discern God's specific calling for your life. Seek God's guidance to walk confidently in your calling.

Reflection: How can you seek God's guidance to discern your specific calling?

Do not quench the Spirit. Do not treat prophecies with contempt but test them all; hold on to what is good, reject every kind of evil." - 1 Thessalonians 5:19-22

As we conclude this journey, commit to a life of discernment by continually testing and holding onto what is good, and rejecting evil. Reflect on what you have learned and how you will continue to grow in discernment. Consider making a personal commitment to seek God's wisdom and guidance in all areas of your life.
