


30-Day Devotional on Rahab: Lessons for Daughters of God

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Day 1 Rahab's Introduction (Joshua 21)

Rahab was a woman with a reputation, yet God chose her for a divine purpose.

God can use anyone, regardless of their past. Trust in His ability to redeem your story.
Reflection Questions: How does Rahab's story challenge your perception of who God can use? What areas of your life do you need to surrender for God's redemptive work?

Day 2: Divine Appointments (Joshua 22-3)

The spies arriving at Rahab's house wasn't a coincidence. Be open to recognizing God's divine appointments in your life.

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Reflection Questions: Can you recall a time when you felt God orchestrated events in your life? How can you be more aware of divine appointments in the future?

Day 3: Courage in Action (Joshua 24-7)

Rahab risked her life by hiding the spies. Living out your faith often requires courage.

Reflection Questions: What risks have you taken for your faith? How do you think Rahab's courage inspires you to trust God in difficult situations?

Day 4 Rahab's Faith Declaration (Joshua 28-11)

Rahab professed her belief in God's sovereignty. Speak boldly about your faith and trust in God's power.

Reflection Questions: What does Rahab's declaration teach you about professing your faith? In what areas of your life do you need to boldly declare your trust in God?

Day 5 A Pact of Protection (Joshua 212-14)

Rahab secured a promise of safety for her family. Intercede for your loved ones asking God to open their minds and hearts to receive the truth. Reflection Questions: Who in your family needs prayer and protection? How can you persist in praying for them?

Day 6 The Scarlet Cord (Joshua 215-21)

The scarlet cord symbolized Rahab's faith and obedience.

Reflection Questions: How does the scarlet cord point to Christ's sacrifice? How can you live each day as a reminder of His covering?

Day 7: Rahab's Place in God's Plan (Joshua 622-25)

Rahab and her family were spared and included in Israel. Celebrate how God can bring redemption and restoration into any life.

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Reflection Questions: Where have you seen God's restoration in your life? How can Rahab's story encourage you to trust in His plans for your future?

Day 8: God Sees Beyond Labels (2 Corinthians 517)

Rahab's past didn't define her future. Embrace your identity in Christ rather than societal labels. Reflection Questions: How do you allow societal labels to influence your identity? How can you fully embrace your new identity in Christ?

Day 9 Faith That Acts (James 225)

Rahab's actions demonstrated her faith. How can you align your actions with your faith?

Reflection Questions: What actions can you take to show your faith today? How does Rahab's example inspire you to act on your beliefs?

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Day 10: Trusting God's Sovereignty (Proverbs 35-6)

Rahab trusted God's plan without seeing the full picture. Lean on God's wisdom rather than your own understanding. Reflection Questions: What areas of your life require deeper trust in God's plan? How can you let go of the need to control outcomes?

Day 11: Boldness in the Face of Fear (Psalm 271)

Rahab acted boldly despite fear. Identify an area where you need to act with courage.
Reflection Questions: What fears hold you back? How can God's presence embolden you?

Day 12 God's Unlikely Heroes (1 Corinthians 127-29)

God often uses unexpected people for His glory. Acknowledge how God can use your unique circumstances.
Reflection Questions: What parts of your story make you feel unqualified? How can you trust God to use you despite your limitations?

Day 13 Redemption's Reach (Isaiah 118)

Rahab's life is a testament to God's redemptive power. Trust God to redeem every part of your story.
Reflection Questions: Where in your life do you need God's redemption? How can you actively seek His transforming power?

Day 14 Living as a New Creation (Ephesians 422-24)

Rahab's new life began when she joined Israel.

Reflection Questions: What old habits do you need to leave behind to walk in newness of life? What areas of your life need renewal? How can you take steps to live as a new creation in Christ?

Day 15: A Woman of Legacy (Matthew 15)

Rahab is part of Jesus' lineage. Your faithfulness today can impact generations to come. Reflection Questions: Where do you judge based on appearances instead of seeking God's perspective? How can you trust God's plan in unlikely circumstances?

Day 16: Choosing God's Side (Joshua 2415)

Rahab chose to align herself with God's people. Make daily choices that align with God's will. Reflection Questions: How can your testimony impact someone today? What part of your story can reveal God's faithfulness?

Day 17: The Power of Testimony (Revelation 1211)

Rahab's story inspired others to trust God. Share your story to encourage others in their faith.
Reflection Questions: What risks are you avoiding due to fear? How can trusting God help you step out in faith?

Day 18: God's Plan in Unlikely Places (Romans 8:28)

God's plan for Rahab unfolded in the midst of her brokenness. Trust that God is working for your good, even in hard seasons.
Reflection Questions: Do you struggle with accepting God's grace? How can you remind yourself daily of His forgiveness?

Day 19: Standing Firm (Ephesians 613)

Rahab stood firm in her faith despite opposition. Equip yourself with God's armor to stand against challenges.

Reflection Questions: How can you stand in all the armor of God? Write down each piece of the armor and explain its purpose.

Day 20: Obedience Unlocks Blessings (Deuteronomy 281-2)

Rahab's obedience led to her family's salvation. Where is God calling you to greater obedience?

Reflection Questions: Are there any promises you've left unfulfilled? How can you reflect God's faithfulness in your commitments?

Day 21: God's Mercy and Grace (Hebrews 416)

Rahab's story is one of God's immense grace. Approach God with confidence, knowing His grace is sufficient.

Reflection Questions: How do you experience belonging in God's family? What steps can you take to welcome others into God's community?	

Day 22 Faith Over Fear (2 Timothy 17)

Rahab's faith overcame her fear. Declare faith over fear in your daily challenges.

Reflection Questions: What challenges are you facing that need God's redemption? How can you trust Him to work through them?

Day 23: A Heart of Worship (Psalm 1001-5)

Rahab joined Israel, a people of worship. Application: Cultivate a lifestyle of worship in response to God's goodness.

Reflection Questions: What areas of obedience are you struggling with? How can Rahab's obedience inspire you to act?

Day 24 Seeing Yourself Through God's Eyes (Psalm 13913-14)

Rahab's worth was rooted in God's plan for her. Embrace your God-given worth and purpose.
Reflection Questions: Where is God calling you to embrace change? How can you trust Him for the unknown?

Day 25 Persevering in Faith (Hebrews 10:23)

Rahab's faith wasn't a one-time act but a lifelong commitment. Commit to enduring faith, no matter the season.

Reflection Questions: How are your choices today impacting future generations? What legacy of faith do you want to leave?

Day 26 God's Family (Galatians 326-29)

Rahab became part of God's covenant people. Celebrate your place in God's family.

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Reflection Questions: How have you seen God's faithfulness in your life? How can Rahab's story encourage you to hold on to His promises?

Day 27: Being a Beacon of Hope (Matthew 5:14-16)

	Rahab's faith brought hope and salvation to her family. Shine as a light in your community.
	Reflection Questions: Who can you share your faith with today? How can Rahab's example motivate you to disciple others?
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Day 28 Trusting God's Promises (2 Peter 39)

Rahab trusted in the spies' promise and God's faithfulness. Stand firm on God's promises in your life. Reflection Questions: Where are you waiting for God's timing? How can you cultivate patience and trust?

Day 29: A Legacy of Faith (Hebrews 1131)

Rahab's faith is celebrated in Scripture. Live in a way that leaves a legacy of faith for others. Reflection Questions: How can you live daily in response to God's grace? What areas of your life need transformation?

Day 30: Your Story, God's Glory (Ephesians 3:20-21)

Rahab's story glorifies God's redemptive power. Surrender your story to God, trusting Him to bring glory through it.
Reflection Questions: How does Rahab's story inspire you to live a life of faith? What steps can you take today to leave a legacy of faith for others?
